# Sarina Gersher, Ward 8 City Councillor

I hope everyone has enjoyed their summer!

Normally I try to share a few updates from City Hall, but I wanted to focus on the recommendations from the Residential Speed Limit Review for this update.

In September, City Council will vote on whether or not to reduce speed limits in residential neighbourhoods. The Administrative recommendations were tabled in August to allow enough time for folks to see the recommendations. The report will be discussed by the Standing Policy Committee on Transportation on September 7, 2021. At this time, they will make a recommendation to Council for consideration.

The Administrative recommendation is as follows:

1. That Option 2 - 40 km/h Speed Limit for residential neighbourhoods be approved in principle;

2. That Option A – Street Classification be approved in principle to determine street eligibility for the speed limit reduction in residential neighbourhoods; and

3. That the 40 km/h speed limit in residential neighbourhoods be approved in principle for local streets and collector streets.

#### Greetings, Greystone Heights!

I'm pleased to provide you with an update on several initiatives I've undertaken recently as your MLA in Saskatoon University.

It's been wonderful to spend time in our riding throughout the summer meeting with constituents and hearing what matters to you most! It's a privilege to serve you.

During this spring's legislative sitting, I tabled a petition calling on the provincial government to implement pay equity legislation. This legislation would ensure that traditionally female-dominated jobs are compensated equitably when compared with traditionally male-dominated jobs. Saskatchewan is one of only a few remaining provinces that has not brought in this legislation. Unsurprisingly, our province also has one of the highest gender pay gaps in Canada. Saskatchewan women demand better of this government.

I also introduced two private member's bills. The first bill I introduced as Associate Labour critic calls on the government to implement paid sick leave for all Saskatchewan workers. So many in our province are left with no option but to go into work when sick and this is simply not right. Providing paid sick leave is a matter of fundamental human decency.

The second bill I introduced as the critic for Status of Women calls on the government to protect reproductive rights for Saskatchewan people by banning protests within a specific radius around facilities that provide abortion services. Harassment and intimidation of those who are accessing or providing medical services is unacceptable.

I will continue pushing the government on these issues and others as we prepare to return to the Legislature in October.

It's an honour to represent the people of Saskatoon University and I am committed to making sure your voices are heard in the Saskatchewan Legislature!
