

Happy Holidays, from my family to yours.

Here are a few winter highlights from City Hall:

The first multi-year budget was completed for 2020/2021. This budget focused on investing in core services (parks, sidewalks, transit, roads, bridges, and snow and ice). Other notable projects include continued investment in the Growth Plan, greenhouse gas reduction initiatives, addressing the growing backlog of property maintenance and nuisance complaints, and approved additional resources to keep residents safe.

A new curbside residential recycling contract beginning January 1, 2020. There has only been a slight modification in what items can be accepted, with black plastic and polycoat (i.e. beverage cups) being removed. All other items previously in the program will be maintained. Check out the Waste Wizard for further information.

Meet one of our Board Members!

Trevor Grabowski - The Rink Guy

The GCA has had a revolving series of board of director biographies. It's my turn, but I'd rather write about my portfolio, the outdoor rink (ODR). I've reached out to neighbours whose arrival into Greystone pre-dates our arrival in 2004. I've tried to contact old rink guy coordinators who looked after the rink in earlier years. I've been able to piece together some history of the rink and the people involved. The best records I've collected are certainly over the last 15-20 years. My apologies if I could not find more information for the early years, 1975-2005.

The term "rink guy" is synonymous across the city. No fancy title is required. Rink guys out there understand we all have a lot in common. I've learned a lot about how other community associations organize and operate their rinks by chatting with their rink guys. But in general, every community has figured out how to operate their rink and keep it running. Without volunteer rink guys the ODR's would not exist.

In the early 70's the community first established the rink directly east of the school, roughly where the playground is located today (pictured next page). According to my sources, the rink relocated to its current positioning when the entire park was re-landscaped. Below are dates of significant developments related to the rink:

- Park rejuvenation, and rink moved to current location (approximately 1995);
- 2006, the GCA built the small storage shack. It stores not only rink equipment, but basketball, football, and soccer equipment. Its an important storage vessel for the GCA; and
- Puck board was added in 2011/2012. This was a 2-3-day long venture by 20-30 volunteers. . This eliminated the need to paint the rink. It also established our ODR on the map as a popular rink in the city.

Around 2009 Bob Bayliss was wrapping up his tenure as rink guy. He managed the rink with his son's. Ted Toporowski (moved away around 2014) talked to Bob about getting involved. Ted spoke with Chris Kilcher, and me. Our three-person crew looked after the rink for 2-3 years.

In 2011, with the help of then GCA President Wes Gramiak, we embarked on the puck board project. The puck board project called for lots of volunteers, and they answered in big numbers. One future rink guy was Darren Frey who helped with puck board, and then decided to join the rink crew permanently. Shortly after Darren joined, Brendan O'Reilly and Newell Hedstrom joined. Four years ago, Conal Hancherow moved to Saskatoon from Edmonton, he joined. James Anderson and Evan Buchan joined. We currently operate the rink with 11-12 rink guys. What's been very welcoming is the addition of four younger rink guys with young families (welcome Trevor Blum, Archie Gillies, Aaron Gaudet, and Bryce Currie). We're hopeful they'll have so much fun they'll take this thing over and keep it going.

Previous to Bob Bayliss' tenure Brian (of Simpson Cr.) was rink coordinator. Brian looked after the rink for several, approximately 1998-2006. I apologize I could not locate Brian's last name. We wanted to recognize his contribution to the rink for 7-8 years. I know who Brian is. Years back he'd be walking his dogs, stop and chat and let us know he used to look after the rink in previous years.

Via community connections, and people knowing other people, we've managed to build a good group to manage

the rink. We're complimented all the time that our ice is great, and that we always quickly remove snow so people can skate. So, if you're new to the neighbourhood and would like to get involved, text me at 306-380-7011. You can never have too many rink guys!

History of Greystone Heights

According to a 1913 map of registered subdivisions, Greystone Heights was originally split in two sections called Queens Park and Queens Park Addition, the latter of which overlapped into the present-day College Park neighbourhood. The land for the neighbourhood was annexed by the city between 1955 and 1959. The majority of home construction took place between 1961 and 1970, and was generally completed by 1980. The street names are mainly those of Canadian universities and professors.

Greystone Heights School – public elementary, part of the Saskatoon Public School Division opened in 1961.
