

# A MESSAGE FROM YOUR WARD 8 CITY COUNCILLOR

#### Hello Neighbours,

I hope everyone is keeping warm and enjoying the start of the winter season. I wanted to give a big thank you to the GCA volunteers who have been preparing indoor and outdoor winter activities for the community.

The end of the years is always a busy time at City Hall. Here are a few updates of the items before City Council:

- Budget Deliberations take place from November 28 30, 2023. I have been sharing updates from our Special Budget Meetings that have been taking place throughout the year. These updates, as well as outcomes from budget deliberations, are available at wardeight.ca.
- In the new year, recommendations tied to the Housing Accelerator Fund will be coming forward. These are in response to direction from the federal government about zoning changes needed at the municipal level to be eligible for significant funding tied to affordable housing investment. Keep up to date on this file at saskatoon.ca/housingactionplan.
- I am happy to share that the City, Province and Federal Governments announced funding for transit/Bus Rapid Transit and a new east side leisure centre. This allows the City to begin implementation of the Bus Rapid Transit work that has been in the planning stages for some time. An update report early in the new year will be provided to Council about what to expect for next steps.

I wanted to bring to your attention that updates are taking place for the Collections Calendar for blue, black and green bin pick-up beginning in 2024. Take a look at the calendar to see what these changes look like for you: saskatoon.ca/collectioncalendar.

But it doesn't stop there! Intergenerational Walking Groups and Intergenerational Games provide opportunities for joint activities, boosting both health and friendships.


To appreciate the wisdom of seniors, kids will honor them with awards in after-school sessions. These after-school opportunities are available for children ages 4 - 17.

Seasons Greetings from the Elmwood Family!


We hope that everyone is enjoying the beautiful fall weather and is having fun preparing for the upcoming Holiday Season! At this time of year when we are reflecting on the past year and giving thanks, Elmwood would like to extend their gratitude for engaging our residents and supporting their transition into the Greystone Heights Community. So, from us, to you, thank you and a very happy Holiday Season.

Elmwood is excited to share that the property at 2920 14th Street is now complete, and possession has taken place. This home has been made possible due to a collaboration between Elmwood, the Ministry of Social Services- Community Living Services Delivery (CLSD) and the Saskatchewan Housing Corporation (SHC). Throughout December, Elmwood will be working to get the home operational which includes all required licensing, set- up of home, recruitment of Team Members and Training and Onboarding. A tentative move- in timeframe is set for mid- late January 2024!

The four residents that will call 2920 14th Street home have visited their new home to see what it looks like and to become familiar with it. As they are very close to moving in, the excitement amongst them is growing! Throughout December and early January, you may see many deliveries taking place as we work to get the home fully set- up.
